Preparing for EVACUATION of Collections



At an **EVACUATION ALERT**

TAKE ACTION Protect collections now *before* the Evacuation Order is issued.

In this priority:



VITAL RECORDS

Identify critical digital and non-digital records such as collection documentation, loan agreements, insurance documents, financial files.

- Ensure vital electronic records are backed up online or on a thumb drive and evacuated with an authorized person
- Pack and relocate critical physical files



THE COLLECTION

Relocate collections if appropriate.

- **Prepare** destination in advance if possible
- Document all actions, especially tracking
- Use museum handling, packing and transport techniques
- Relocate objects to a different room, building or geographic area as required
- Evacuate items in order of highest value and / or those at greatest risk



THE BUILDING

Take actions to reduce the risk of damage.

Inside Building

- Take down flammable curtains and window treatments
- Turn on interior and exterior lights

Outside Building

- Remove combustible materials such as furniture, woodchips, brush, leaves, awnings and banners from around the building
- Disconnect automatic door openers such as loading bay and overhead doors to allow access if power is out
- Turn off or block exterior air intake to avoid smoke from entering building
- **Connect** water hoses and fill garbage cans or other large containers to assist firefighters
- Ensure building is secure

At an **EVACUATION ORDER**

EVACUATE Protect yourself and your family immediately!

- Follow routes specified by officials
- Continue to monitor security systems if possible and applicable

DO NOT return to building until Evacuation Order has been rescinded.
