New Electrify Canada Ultra-Fast Charging Station Begins Construction at Revelstoke Railway Museum

Revelstoke, BC – (September 10, 2021) – The Revelstoke Railway Museum, home to the mountain history of the Canadian Pacific Railway, takes a step toward Canada's electric future as it welcomes a new Electrify Canada electric vehicle (EV) charging station, providing the community of Revelstoke with a fast and convenient charging location.

The Electrify Canada charging station is expected to open by the end of 2021 and will occupy the northwest corner of the museum's parking lot, parallel to Farrell Road. The station will be equipped with four chargers that can charge capable vehicles at some of the fastest charging speeds available today - up to 150kW or 350kW.

"Electrify Canada is pleased to continue the expansion of its ultra-fast charging network in British Columbia with the launch of its tenth station in the province," said Julie McKenna, Manager of Site Development and Construction, Electrify Canada. "The Revelstoke Railway Museum is conveniently located along the Trans-Canada highway, making it a great stop for EV drivers visiting the museum and the downtown core, as well as people on road trips looking for a location to charge up."

"We look forward to offering the convenience of an EV charging station to Revelstokians and visitors," said Roger Eddy, President of the Revelstoke Heritage Railway Society. "Revelstoke has always been an important transportation hub in the Columbia mountains. We are proud to step towards our electric future and enable EV adoption in our community, providing accessible, convenient, ultra-fast charging to current and future EV drivers."

Revelstoke has deep roots with the railway. The Revelstoke Heritage Railway Society was incorporated in 1988 with the dream of bringing railway history back to Revelstoke, one of Canada's oldest railway towns. Its major project was development and construction of the Revelstoke Railway Museum in 1993, a grass-roots project driven by community leaders and which enjoyed the broad support of Revelstoke's citizens, businesses and the public sector. Designed by Architect Paul Hughes, the Museum was built by local craftsmen using locally-sourced timber sawn at local mills. Widely recognized as one of the best small railway museums in Canada, the Museum has delighted over 500,000 visitors since opening in 1993. It won a TripAdvisor Travelers Choice Award in 2020. The Museum is currently open daily from 9 AM to 4 PM.
