This 4-day, in-person Symposium is expected to draw a mix of professional and avocational individuals in the field of paleontology and provide opportunity to present and hear the latest news and breakthroughs in paleontology within British Columbia and beyond. TENTATIVE SCHEDULE:

Organizers are planning for one day of workshops and paleontology-related tours, two days of oral presentations, posters and displays, a day of fieldtrips on scenic Vancouver Island, an evening dinner, and other social events to provide ample time throughout the weekend to socialize, network and engage in informal discussion. The main events will take place at the Bob Wright Centre at the University of Victoria.

Friday, June 9: Workshops, Tours & Social Event

Workshops (hands-on and demonstrations) are in planning. Participation will be limited and require pre-registration. Additional fees may apply, to be confirmed when online registration opens. Workshops under development include:

- Identification of ammonites
- Identification of plants
- Silicone peel demonstration

Tours will include advanced scientific facilities in the Bob Wright Centre (chemical, analytical and isotope facilities, and advanced microscopy facilities), and tours of the Royal BC Museum in downtown Victoria.

An evening social event will provide opportunity for registrants to meet and mingle in a relaxed atmosphere.

Saturday, June 10: Presentations & Awards Dinner

Saturday will feature a keynote speaker to be announced soon. The speaker will kick off a full day of oral presentations, interspersed with poster and fossil displays. The evening will feature a dinner to mingle and provide an opportunity to present awards and/or recognize contributions to paleontology in British Columbia.

Sunday, June 11: Presentations

Sunday will also feature a keynote speaker, to be announced soon. The speaker will begin day two of presentations with further time to enjoy posters, displays and interaction with other registrants. No official events are planned for Sunday evening to accommodate departure for those not remaining to participate in fieldtrips.

Monday, June 12: Field Trips

Fieldtrips will be offered on Southern Vancouver Island, featuring current research, where possible. Participation will be limited and require pre-registration. Transportation and lunches will be provided. Additional fees may apply, to be confirmed when online registration opens.

The duration of each talk and their follow-up question period will be decided once the full program is established. Poster dimensions must not exceed

4' by 4'. Display boards and pins will be provided.
