Judy was not sure about the exact dates she worked in Vernon, she said 1959 to 1946 but later she said she worked there for 25 years.  Judy loved her job. Back then people did not have phones like they do today, growing up if she wanted to make a phone call she went to the grocery store. So things went through the CN office. She took bids (people applying for jobs) death notices, special announcements and such. To help explain how the process worked she was asked to explain how Carolyn Ben could send her resume in for a job. She said Carolyn could come in person, or call her on the phone. Judy would take the sender info and the address and the content, then she would decide what sort of telegraph she needed. There was the RX telegraph which meant urgent, which Judy would do for a death or a bid. There was a regular telegraph that went during the day, which Judy would probably use for Carolyn's resume. But there was also the night telegraph which went during the night and was the cheapest. Judy felt that sending telegrams in general was fairly affordable. 	But in the last few years of her time there she felt a sense that the era of the telegraph was coming to an end. Less messages were being sent, and BC Tel (now TELUS) had a huge room of computers which let people send messages right to Victoria without needing to use a telegraph machine. She sent her last telegram in the early 60s (maybe).			
	Judy liked her job because she liked the people, the coworkers and customers. They were like her family. There were not to many people in the office, for a while they shared it with the ticket agent for the train, then it was just telegraphs. There was a manager, who for many years was Frank Williamson (he also worked for City Council), the book keeper and the telephone operator. Men and women worked as operators. When asked about the make-up of the staff she said that the man who fixed the machines, Ed Tanka, was Japanese. Judy felt that race did not matter as much back then, that it was not something she ever thought about like we do today.			
	Vernon was, she explained, much smaller then. Everyone knew everyone, if you walked the street you recognized everyone. Because of her job at the office she knew all the gossip but felt instinctively that she was sworn to secrecy. However, when asked about a telegraph that stood out she was willing to share that once a mother came into the office. The woman had no husband and her son had been killed by a truck while biking home from school. She was there to send a message to her relatives on the coast telling them about the death her son. Judy remembered that she was a very sweet lady.			
	When asked how she ended up with the office supplies she said she heard they were closing down and they were going to be taken to the dump, and knew her kids would like playing with them so she took it.
