CITY OF BURNABY PERMANENT ART COLLECTION

The City of Burnaby Permanent Art Collection is comprised of over 7000 works of art. Managed by the Burnaby Art Gallery, the collection is largely made up of works on paper (particularly original hand pulled prints) by Canadian artists. The Gallery began to specialize its collection practices in the 1970s, so that today 97% of objects held in the collection are works on paper.

The Burnaby Art Gallery seeks to deaccession items outside its collection mandate (such as paintings on canvas or board, ceramic works, and sculpture) through offer to fellow Canadian institutions. Currently the Gallery is open to either a) trades offering works on paper by artists of local, national or international significance, or b) transfer of ownership without trade.
