## 1. SUMMARY AND BACKGROUND

Métis Nation British Columbia (MNBC) is the Métis government in British Columbia. With over 25,000 registered citizens, MNBC's mission is to develop and enhance opportunities for Métis people and communities by implementing culturally relevant, social and economic programs and services

MNBC's Ministry of Culture, Heritage and Language is the current secretariat for the Amelia Douglas Institute (ADI) and is currently support the Institute's operations. The Amelia Douglas Institute is the centre of Métis culture and language resources and programming in British Columbia. The institute's province-wide network is dedicated to educating Métis people and the public about Métis culture and way of life, through educational and interactive exhibitions, programs, and research. We have a collection of over 30 material art objects, including modern pieces in traditional styles and grandmother items.



### 2. PROJECT PURPOSE AND SCOPE

MNBC's Ministry of Culture, Heritage and Language is seeking professional services to photograph the ADI collection for documentation and research purposes, as well as capture a record of our exhibitions. The photography project will comprise 40 hours and end, with a possibility of renewal, March 27th, 2026.

MNBC is seeking professional services to support the Amelia Douglas Institute by:

- Visually documenting a small permanent collection of Métis art (approx. 30 objects) at high resolution at the ADI space in Surrey, BC.
- Measuring the objects in the collection for a record of height, width, and depth.
- Visual documenting of exhibitions both for internal records and for marketing and promotions).
- Visual documenting any exhibit openings or other events.
- Providing most or all of their own equipment (ie. Camera, lighting, backdrops, shadowboxes).
- Advising, supporting, and collaborating with MNBC staff on visual media, collections documentation, and equipment purchase.
- Meeting monthly with MNBC staff to coordinate the contract and scheduling.

## 3. PROPOSAL GUIDELINES

### a) Project Consultant/Team

a. Provide the name, role and qualifications of each person on the project team.

### b) Qualifications

- The successful proponent must have experience in fine art photography and/or commercial photography, as well as photographing museums, gallery, and exhibition spaces.
- Knowledge of the Indigenous arts, heritage, and language sector in British Columbia and/or Canada is considered an asset.
- Knowledge of cultural institutes, museums, or galleries is considered an asset.

Provide contact information for professional references related to the job qualifications listed above.

### 4. PROPOSAL EVALUATION CRITERIA

The contract for work will be awarded by MNBC based on the quality of the proposal, including but not limited to the qualifications and experience of the consultant, cost estimate submitted to MNBC for its consideration. The contract award is not necessarily based on the lowest bid.
