The base of the burner fixture is perforated, and the clear glass chimney is peariform in shape. The chimney also has DOMINION C in raised lettering, likely a reference to Dominion Glass with the C indicating that it was manufactured in May or June. It has a round base. Embossed at the top is ROYAL SAFETY, and embossed next to a fuel cap with a flower pattern is SAFETY TUBULAR.	Extensive orange rusting throughout. Silver metal crumpled and corroded at base.
1973.087.130	Lamp		Kerosene lamp listed as a "railroad flare"—essentially a tin watering or oil can with a C-shaped handle and a pompom-esque cloth wick stuffed into the spout. The base has an "I" written in black marker. Two small chain links are attached to the top. Raised lettering on one side reads C.P.R. Previous cataloguer noted that it "may be just an oil can." (No other information listed.)	Extensive rusting throughout. Scratches and dents on spout. Brown staining on cloth wick.
1989.101.002	Lantern		Bright red railway kerosene lantern with a round base, carrying handle, screw cap to fill the bowl, and glass globe. FEUER HAND is embossed on the base. Additionally, writing on the shade reads REGISTERED TRADEMARK NO 1175 FEUERHAND feuerfest MADE IN GERMANY with two outlined capital A's flanking the writing. The join between the base and the globe is unpainted and silver; a tin loop is attached to this portion. The screw cap has the Feuer Hand logo, which is a hand holding flame. Next to the cap, embossed lettering reads 175 W GERMANY.	Minor tarnishing of unpainted tin neck between base and burner.
2013.058.008	Globe, Lamp		Deep red peariform glass lamp globe for signal light/lantern. Has GTR embossed on the side in a rectangle with raised borders. Mouldmade. Used with lantern 2013.058.006 (deaccessioned).	Good condition
2014.002.023	Lantern		Tin C.P.R. trainman's kerosene lamp with a wooden handle and cage structure. C.P.R. appears in raised letters atop the upper flange, as well as THE HIRAM L. PIPER CO. LTD. The base has raised lettering reading ADLAKE-KERO 4-38 U.S.A. 141.633 L(?)IS63[...]415 63566019 CANADA 1921-1923 PATS PENDING.	Well used with a crack appearing in the upper area of the glass chimney. Electricians tape is holding on the handle to the main body; tape is stained. Some cobwebs inside and scratches throughout. Orange rust around round perforations near base, inside lantern, and at the top of the vent.
