<p>Turner rowboat</p>	<p>Approximately 12 ft; a stock rowboat from Turner Boats built in their shop on Vancouver's Coal Harbour. These were and are legendary on the BC Coast. Many coastal people would have purchased a rowboat like this for transportation</p>	
<p><i>Daisy</i></p>	<p>A sailing dingy Daisy with mast, and center board. Built by volunteers at Britannia.</p>	
<p><i>Stumpy</i></p>	<p>An 8.5' wooden sailing dingy with green painted lower exterior, carvel-built with brass rivets and square leather wrapped oars. Comes with centerboard, rudder, rudder handle, mast, spar and oars. Built or restored by volunteers at Britannia.</p>
